Preparing a Medical Summary

Why?

- To describe the existing medical information for a new audience
- To begin interpreting medical information from a rehabilitation orientation
- To provide a medical rationale for your rehabilitation or work plan for the client

Methodology: Approaching the Task

- Request medical records if you haven't already received them
 - Obtain release of medical information from client
 - Contact providers and request med records
- Medical records are sent to you via mail, FedEx, courier, pick-up
- Be polite and persistent in acquiring medical information from providers and sources

Preparing a Medical Summary

Methodology: Review Hospitalizations Look for

- Admissions/Intake Summary or
- Discharge Summary
 - in
 - Treatment records
 - Chart notes
 - Surgery Records
 - Inpatient Evals and Therapies

Methodology: Review Diagnostics Look for

- Summaries, Impressions, Discussions from
- Consultations, Reports, Correspondence regarding
 - Surgery (Operative Reports)
 - Radiology (Diagnostic Impressions)
 - Neurological (EEGs) and Neuromuscular (EMGs) function
 - Cardiac (ECGs/EKGs) function
 - Nerve conduction studies
 - Other diagnostic modalities

Preparing a Medical Summary

Methodology: Review Outpt Therapies Look for

- Intake Summaries, Initial Evaluations
 or
- Discharge Summaries
 - or
- Recommendations

from

- OT, PT, ST
- Psychology or Counseling
- Cognitive Rehabilitation
- Nutrition/Dietetics
- Alternative Therapies (Hyperbaric O2)

Preparing a Medical Summary

Methodology: Review Outpt Evaluations

Look for

• Summaries, Impressions, Discussions, and Recommendations

from

- Functional Capacities Evaluations
- Vocational Evaluations
- Neuropsychological Evaluations
- Psychiatric Evaluations

Methodology: Review Services

Look for

 Summaries, Impressions, Discussions, or Recommendations

from

- Other Medical Management
- Insurance
- Social Work
- Accommodations/Equipment
- Educational records (IEPs)
- Pharmacy records

Preparing a Medical Summary

Records: Important vs. Relevant

How to decide?

All records are important

Not all data are relevant

Important

 - Hx of injury/injuries
 - Diagnoses
 - Treatments
 - Therapies
 - Meds
 - Outcomes
 - Prognoses
- Functional capacities-FCE
- · Sociodemographic info

 - Intake/admission summary
 - Discharge summary
 - Diagnoses
 - ImpressionsRecommendations
 - Meds
- FCE
 - Impressions
 - Recommendations
- · Sociodemographic info

Preparing a Medical Summary **Expected Volume** Received Produced • Med/Psych Hx • Med/Psych Hx and - Pages and pages FCE • FCE - Two to five summary - Five to ten pages paragraphs Sociodemographics • Sociodemographics - From interview notes - One to two summary paragraphs

- Rationale

Preparing a Medical Summary

Formatting

- · Order data in such a way that it makes sense to you
- Unfold profile in logical, clear, and concise manner
- Data may vary among records; present in a consistent manner within each report and across reports (be consistent in your style)

Formatting

Introductory paragraph (if needed)
Choose whether to use chronology or medical specialty or other means of organization of data
Write clearly and understandably for the audience you are addressing, not yourself
